


MISSION STATEMENT

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Band members who want to access the Local Delivery Mechanism for funding must:

- 1. Be unemployed; and
- 2. Be on an active Employment Insurance claim; or have been on Employment Insurance within the last three years; or be an individual who established and was paid a claim for EI maternity or parental benefits within the past five (5) years; or on Social Assistance; or have no income.

Funding cannot be accessed if you are employed or a student. These eligibility requirements must be met for all programs under Batchewana Employment and Training.


