Summary of survey data up to June 2020

Community Survey

94 completed surveys → **30%** of the On-Reserve 15+ population

As more of the population is surveyed - the more precise the information becomes

Based on the current number of respondents in this community, the accuracy of the data is within + or - 8 percentage points.

Education

63% completed at least some Post-secondary



66% also reported other licenses or certificates

15% reported other training or courses

Job status

When taking into account **traditional and occasional jobs**



Traditional skills jobs include things like fishing, hunting, crafts, guiding

Occasional/informal paid jobs include things like babysitting, repairs, cleaning

Most common skills



Outdoor maintenance



Cooking, preparation and/or preservation of food



Use of boats, snowmobiles, ATVs



Least common skills



Computer programming, creating apps



Repairing appliance, small engines, motors



Storytelling, writing stories, poems, songs

Administrative officers

26% plan to go back to school in the next year



43% are interested in future training



45% are interested in receiving job notifications matching their skills and interests
