On-Reserve LMI Pilot Project Summary of survey data up to June 2020

Community Survey

71 completed surveys → **46%** of the On-Reserve 15+ population

As more of the population is surveyed - the more precise the information becomes

Based on the current number of respondents in this community, the accuracy of the data is within + or - 9 percentage points.

Education

42% completed at least some Post-secondary



78% also reported other licenses or certificates

11% reported other training or courses

Job status

When taking into account traditional and occasional jobs



Traditional skills jobs include things like fishing, hunting, crafts, guiding

Occasional/informal paid jobs include things like babysitting, repairs, cleaning

Most common skills



Outdoor maintenance



Cooking, preparation and/or preservation of food



Indoor maintenance



Typing, word processing, using software



Least common skills



Computer programming, creating apps



Repairing appliance, small engines, motors



Identification and harvesting of local plants

Most common jobs

Public works and maintenance labourers



Receptionists

Cashiers

Carpenters

Contractors and supervisors, carpentry trades

Future intentions



30% plan to go back to school in the next year



59% are interested in future training



55% are interested in receiving job notifications matching their skills and interests
