This role provides a unique opportunity to represent the Nation in archaeological assessments and burial site investigations while gaining valuable field experience throughout MCFN Treaty Territory. Whether you are beginning your career or looking for meaningful seasonal work, this position offers the opportunity to contribute directly to the protection of Indigenous history, culture, and heritage.

Key Responsibilities

In this role, you will:

- Participate in archaeological fieldwork and burial site investigations while representing MCFN in a respectful and professional manner.
- Conduct excavation monitoring and field activities in accordance with established policies, procedures, and cultural protocols.
- Maintain accurate daily field notes, observations, and documentation using designated reporting applications.
- Support Lead Field Liaison Representatives and Field Supervisors in completing archaeological assessments and field investigations.
- Communicate field observations, concerns, and updates to team members and supervisors in a timely manner.
- Ensure all field documentation, reports, and records are completed accurately and submitted on schedule.
- Follow all health and safety requirements, including the use of personal protective equipment (PPE), and report hazards or incidents as required.
